A School Enrichment Program

CSU Extension- Arapahoe County offers several 4-H School Enrichment programs that can be delivered to county classrooms for extra-special fun and learning. These programs are designed to be offered in school by Extension staff and volunteers, and serve to complement curriculum across many disciplines.

The 4-H Embryology Program:

- Gives students the opportunity to learn about chickens, eggs, and embryonic development through observation of the egg hatching process.
- Provides a great way for students to observe the development of life in just three weeks.
- Includes teacher curriculum resources, 18 eggs, an incubator, brooder, feeder, waterer, heat source, feed, shavings and instruction packet. An extension professional will also come to your classroom to deliver instruction twice during the program. Content is grade specific and can be tailored to meet learning objectives.
- Many of the lessons in the curriculum will help to build children's math, science and language arts skills. The cost is \$45 per incubator.
