Larimer County Livestock Field Day

They will be holding a Livestock Field Day this Saturday, February 23. This is another opportunity for Livestock members to complete their MQA training.

MQA training is required by the State Office for all Livestock members. This does include all Rabbits, including Companion, Breeding/Show and Market and All Poultry, including Breeding Chickens, Market Chickens, Breeding Ducks, Market Ducks, Breeding Geese, Market Geese, Breeding Turkeys, Market Turkeys and Pigeons, Breeding & Market Beef, Breeding & Market Goat, Dairy Goat, Pygmy Goat, Breeding & Market Sheep, Breeding & Market Swine and Dairy Cattle.

You need to attend once as a Junior member, ages 8 - 13 and once as a Senior member, ages 14 - 18. So if you are new to Livestock or if you turned 14 in 2018, then you will be required to attend the MQA training.

It will be held at The Ranch Events Complex, Loveland, Colorado - 4-H McKee Building. We will also be holding project workshops during the day.

MQA training will begin at 10 a.m. - 3 p.m. Please arrive by 2:30 at the latest to complete the MQA training by 3 p.m.
