### 4-H Dog Rally Class Placement

Division	Class Name	Class Registration Eligibility *	Class Registration Progression**
<b>Novice Division</b>	<b>Rally Novice A</b>	This class is open ONLY to exhibitor and dog teams in their very first year of Rally training.	<p>Exhibitor and dog teams can only stay in this class for one year. Once a qualifying score is received at the County level or State Fair 4-H Dog Trials, the team must move to Rally Intermediate A class or higher Division to be eligible for the State Fair 4-H Dog Trials the following year.</p> <p>If the team does not earn a qualifying score at the County level or State Fair 4-H Dog Trials, the team MUST move to Rally Novice B to be eligible for State 4-H Dog Trials the following year.</p>
	<b>Rally Novice B</b>	This class is open to exhibitor and dog teams in their second or higher years in Rally Novice training with no qualifying score in Rally Novice A, OR an experienced handler starting a new dog.	Exhibitor and dog teams can stay in this class until receiving a qualifying score at the County level or State Fair 4-H Dog Trials. Once a qualifying score is received, the team must move to the Rally Intermediate A class or a higher Division to be eligible for the State Fair 4-H Dog Trials the following year.
<b>Intermediate Division</b>	<b>Rally Intermediate A</b>	This class is open to exhibitor and dog teams in their first year of Rally Intermediate training.	<p>Exhibitor and dog teams can only stay in this class for one year. Once a qualifying score is received at the County level or State Fair 4-H Dog Trials, the team must move to the Rally Advanced A class or a higher Division to be eligible for the State Fair 4-H Dog Trials the following year.</p> <p>If the team does not earn a qualifying score at the County level or State Fair 4-H Dog Trials, the team MUST move to Rally Intermediate B to be eligible for State 4-H Dog Trials the following year.</p>
	<b>Rally Intermediate B</b>	This class is open to exhibitor and dog teams in their second or higher years in Rally Intermediate training with no qualifying score in Rally Intermediate A.	Exhibitor and dog teams can stay in this class until receiving a qualifying score at the County level or State Fair 4-H Dog Trials. Once a qualifying score is received, the team must move to the Rally Advanced A class or a higher Division to be eligible for the State Fair 4-H Dog Trials the following year.
<b>Advanced Division</b>	<b>Rally Advanced A</b>	<p>This class is open to exhibitor and dog teams in their first year of Rally Advanced training.</p> <p>Exhibitor and dog teams are encouraged to enter this class after successful completion of Intermediate Rally <b>OR</b> with approval of their County Dog Superintendent.</p>	<p>Exhibitor and dog teams can only stay in this class for one year. Once a qualifying score is received at the County level or State Fair 4-H Dog Trials, the team must move to the Rally Excellent A class or a higher Division to be eligible for the State Fair 4-H Dog Trials the following year.</p> <p>If the team does not earn a qualifying score at the County level or State Fair 4-H Dog Trials, the team MUST move to Rally Advanced B to be eligible for State 4-H Dog Trials the following year.</p>

<p><b>Advanced Division</b> <i>(Continued)</i></p>	<p><b>Rally Advanced B</b></p>	<p>This class is open to exhibitor and dog teams in their second or higher years in Rally Advanced training and no qualifying score in Rally Advanced A.</p>	<p>Exhibitor and dog teams can stay in this class until receiving a qualifying score at the County level or State Fair 4-H Dog Trials. Once a qualifying score is received, the team must move to the Rally Excellent A class or a higher Division to be eligible for the State Fair 4-H Dog Trials the following year.</p>
<p><b>Excellent Division</b></p>	<p><b>Rally Excellent A</b></p>	<p>This class is open to exhibitor and dog teams in their first year of Rally Excellent training. Exhibitor and dog teams are encouraged to enter this class after successful completion of Advanced Rally <b>OR</b> with approval of their County Dog Superintendent.</p>	<p>Exhibitor and dog teams can only stay in this class for one year. Once a qualifying score is received at the County level or State Fair 4-H Dog Trials, the team must move to the Rally Advanced/Excellent A class or a higher Division to be eligible for the State Fair 4-H Dog Trials the following year.</p> <p>If the team does not earn a qualifying score at the County level or State Fair 4-H Dog Trials, the team <b>MUST</b> move to Rally Excellent B to be eligible for State 4-H Dog Trials the following year.</p>
	<p><b>Rally Excellent B</b></p>	<p>This class is open to exhibitor and dog teams in their second or more years in Rally Excellent training with no qualifying score in Rally Excellent A.</p>	<p>Exhibitor and dog teams can stay in this class until receiving a qualifying score at the County level or State Fair 4-H Dog Trials. Once a qualifying score is received, the team must move to the Rally RAE A class or a higher Division to be eligible for the State Fair 4-H Dog Trials the following year.</p>
<p><b>Rally Advanced/Excellent Division</b></p>	<p><b>Rally Advanced/Excellent A (RAE-A)</b></p>	<p>This class is open only to exhibitor and dog teams in their first year of Rally Advanced/Excellent (RAE) training.</p> <p>Exhibitor and dog teams are encouraged to enter this class after successful completion of Rally Excellent <b>OR</b> with approval of their County Dog Superintendent.</p>	<p>Exhibitor and dog teams can only stay in this class for one year.</p> <p>Regardless of whether a qualifying score is received at the County level or State Fair 4-H Dog Trials, or an equivalent title is earned from a national dog association, <b>ALL</b> teams must move to RAE B or Rally Master to be eligible for the State Fair 4-H Dog Trials with the same dog the following year.</p>
	<p><b>Rally Advanced/Excellent B (RAE-B)</b></p>	<p>This class is open to exhibitor and dog teams in their second or higher years in Rally Advanced/Excellent (RAE) training.</p>	<p>Exhibitor and dog teams may continue to compete in this class with the same dog for the remainder of their 4-H years regardless of whether a qualifying score is earned, or an equivalent title is received from a national dog association. Exhibitor and dog teams also have the <u>option</u> to move to the Rally Master class.</p>

Master Division	Rally Master A	<p><b>OPTIONAL CLASS</b> -- This class is open to exhibitor and dog teams in their first year of Rally Master training. Exhibitor and dog teams are encouraged to enter this class after successful completion of Rally RAE <b>OR</b> with approval of their County Dog Superintendent.</p>	<p>Exhibitor and dog teams can only stay in this class for one year.</p> <p>Once shown in Rally Master, exhibitor and dog teams <b>MUST</b> move to the Rally Master B class and can no longer compete in any lower rally classes.</p>
	Rally Master B	<p><b>OPTIONAL CLASS</b> -- This class is open to exhibitor and dog teams in their second or higher years in Rally Master training.</p>	<p>Exhibitor and dog teams may continue to compete in this class <u>for the remainder of their 4-H years</u> with the same dog, regardless of whether a qualifying score is earned or an equivalent title is received from a national dog association.</p> <p>Once shown in Rally Master, exhibitor and dog teams can no longer compete in any lower Rally classes.</p>
<p>* If a team earns an equivalent title from a national dog association (AKC, UKC, etc.) <u>MORE</u> than 4 months prior to the State Fair 4-H Dog Trials, they are disqualified from competing in that same level at State Fair. They may still compete at that level if the title is received <u>LESS</u> than 4 months prior to State Fair.</p>			
<p>** Counties have discretion for class placement and may elect to use qualifying scores from either County Fair <u>OR</u> State Fair as the criteria for class progression. However, 4-H State Dog Trial Rules will govern eligibility for State Fair 4-H Dog Trial entries. Exhibitor and dog teams earning a qualifying score in a Rally class at County Fair are strongly encouraged to move up to the next higher class the following year, regardless of whether they attend State Fair. Once a team obtains a qualifying score at the State Fair 4-H Dog Trials, that exhibitor is no longer eligible to compete in that same class with the same dog in subsequent years at State Fair.</p>
